# Fiscal Update 2020-21

- The 2020-21 ADA hold harmless provision provides protection for charter schools.
  - Anticipate 2021-22 apportionment will be based on Current year (CY) ADA



# Fiscal Update Continued

- No ADA reporting in 2020-21 for apportionment purposes
- Cash deferrals, the Education Protection Account (EPA) not subject to deferrals

# Education Trailer Bill SB 820

- Senate Bill (SB) 820 Chapter 110/2020 education budget cleanup trailer bill
- Provides growth funding for LEAs based **on the lesser of:**
  - Projected enrollment or ADA growth in 2019-20 2nd Interim or 2020-21 budget that was adopted by June 30, 2020
  - Enrollment on Census Day (10/7/20) reduced by the statewide average absence rate for the appropriate grade levels (to arrive at a measure of ADA)
- No growth funding for nonclassroom-based charter schools

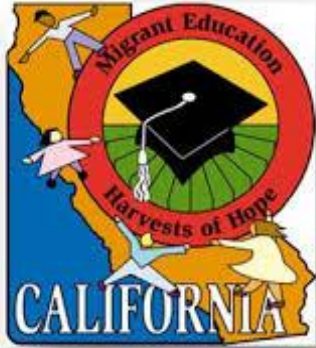

# What is the Migrant Education Program?



- ▶ The Migrant Education Program is a supplemental Title I, Part C, federally funded program.
- ▶ The program links students and families to school/community resources and provides supplemental services to migratory children ages 3-21.
- ▶ Supplemental programs include:
  - Preschool Programs
  - After School Programs
  - Summer Programs and Academic Excursions
  - Liaison and Advocacy Services and Referrals
  - Health Screenings
  - Parent Workshops
  - Graduation Support

# Migrant Education Program



- ▶ There are a total of 23 Migrant Education Program Regional offices.
- ▶ Santa Clara County Office of Education represents Region 1

Region 1 covers 6 counties in the Bay Area:

- Santa Clara County
- San Benito County
- Santa Cruz County
- San Francisco County
- Alameda County
- San Mateo County

# What supplemental services are provided through MEP?

- ▶ Academic Services
  - School Readiness, ages 3-5
  - Regular School Year services, K-12
  - Summer Services, K-12
- ▶ Health Services
  - Vision & Dental Screenings
  - Referrals
  - Mental Health Services
- ▶ Additional
  - Bus Pass assistance
  - Advocacy, social service referrals

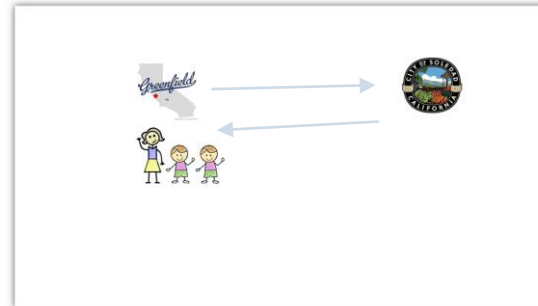

# How do families qualify for MEP?

## ► Eligibility Requirements:

- Family must have moved in the past 36 months AND worked in agricultural or fishing industry
- Move was made from one residence to another residence due to economic necessity
- Move was between one district to another district
- Children are under age of 21 or have not yet received a high school diploma/GED
